The bibliography is a listing of where you found your information. It gives credit and credibility to your report.

Follow these color codes:

**For books:** Author. Book Title. City where published: Publisher, Copyright date.

**For magazines/periodicals:** Author of the article. "Title of the article." Title of the magazine/periodical. Date: Page numbers.

Cure, K. "Welcoming the Year of the Monkey." Travel. 15 January 1980: 60-63.

**For encyclopedias:** Author of the article. "Title of the article." Title of the encyclopedia. Copyright Date. Volume.

Myers, Robert J. "Feasts and Festivals." The World Book Encyclopedia. 1986. Vol. 3.

**For Internet articles:** Author of the page. "Title of page." Title of Home Page. Date published. Retrieved date < Web address >.

**For Images:** "file name." Title of the page. Retrieved date <Web address >.

**For Non-Print (sound, film, interview, CD, DVD):** Director, composer, or conductor. Title. Performer. Source. Publisher, Copyright Date.

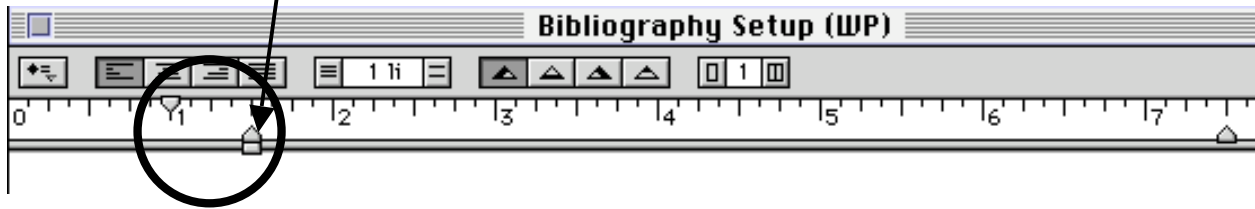

## SETTING THE RULER FOR A BIBLIOGRAPHY

Set the left paragraph markers as shown. Drag the triangle in 1/2 inch. NOTE: drag only the bottom triangle, not the rectangle under it.



## TYPING THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

Put your sources in **alphabetical order** according to the author's last name. Then type them in according to the "Bibliography Guidelines". Remember to leave two spaces between each item of information. Below is an example.
